

CHATTERBOX 1

HOW TO MAKE YOUR CHATTERBOX CONVERSATION-STARTER

1. Cut along dotted line.
2. Fold it in half, fold out. Then fold in half the other way, and fold out.
3. With the blank side up, fold each corner into the middle.
4. Turn the chatterbox over and repeat (again folding each corner into the middle).
5. Place the chatterbox with the numbers side up and fold in half (into a rectangle shape).
6. Slide your thumb and pointer finger of both hands behind the corners and press together so that the chatterbox bends and forms a point in the middle.
7. The words Oxfam Hunger Banquet Quiz should now be facing up.
8. Repeat with the remaining chatterboxes (we've provided three in total).
9. You now have a conversation starter for use during your Hunger Banquet.

ANSWERS

1. The global livestock industry has a bigger greenhouse gas footprint than global transport industry.
2. False. But 2014 was officially the world's hottest year on record. Last year was Australia's third-warmest on record.
3. True. In 2017 the 10 biggest food and beverage companies were responsible for 263.7 million tonnes of greenhouse gases. This is as much as Denmark, Finland, Norway and Sweden combined.
4. Rising sea levels, changing seasons, and a rise in the intensity of extreme weather events are some of the impacts of climate change. These are making it harder to grow food in many countries.
5. Australians waste four million tonnes of food each year (that is 345kg per household or 20% of the food we purchase).
6. One in three people around the world depend on food produced by small-scale producers.
7. True. Climate change is one of the single biggest threats to our chances of winning the fight against hunger.
8. Climate change is expected to drive up the retail price of Kellogg's Cornflakes by as much as 44% over the next 15 years due to the rising price of commodities like corn and rice.


