3. We support First Peoples Justice

As a non-indigenous organisation, Oxfam Australia acts in solidarity with First Peoples' communities, following their lead and working to amplify their voices.

Consistent with the Uluru Statement of the Heart, we call for:

- A First Nations Voice enshrined in the Australian Constitution.
- A Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement making between governments and First Nations and truth-telling about the history of First Peoples.

Reforming the Justice System:

• The Federal government to play a leadership role and work with the States and Territories to redirect resources from punitive measures into First Peoples community-led initiatives aimed at reducing incarceration and contact with the criminal justice system.

Transfer Power to Communities:

- Grow Indigenous Rangers Program and pay respect to First • Nations peoples' authority, knowledge and experience derived from many millennia of custodianship over land and water.
- Support the role of First Nations' organisations in the design of • the Close the Gap policy and targets to achieve socio-economic equality for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
