FOREWORD

The Oxfam Australia Volunteer Engagement Program Team are pleased to present the 2022 Oxfam Australia Volunteer Impact Report. This is the eighth impact report developed by the team which acknowledges and celebrates the meaningful contributions of volunteers, interns, and secondees (collectively referred to as volunteers) at our organisation.

This report will outline the significant contributions of Oxfam Australia's volunteers and the many ways that they enable a positive impact for the organisation. This report comes at a pivotal time for the volunteer-involving sector and Oxfam Australia, as we seek to grow our Volunteer Engagement Program following several years of disruption due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We seek to enable an environment which encourages inclusive and innovative forms of volunteering to respond to sector trends. As such, this report will outline how our program has been able to work toward achieving this aspiration.

The Volunteer Engagement Program Team would like to acknowledge thank all volunteers who contributed their time and effort to Oxfam Australia in 2022. Your contributions are valued, and we are grateful for your assistance in helping Oxfam work towards realise our vision of a more equitable world.

KEY FINDINGS

- 856 Oxfam Australia volunteers, interns, and secondees contributed 25,735 hours of their time during 2022
- The financial value of volunteer contributions across all programs at Oxfam Australia was \$1.28m
- The return of Oxfam Trailwalker in Melbourne & Sydney saw volunteer numbers increase by nearly 700 people compared to the previous year
- Volunteers contributed their time to Oxfam to eliminate poverty, improve vocational skills, and to make a difference
- In 2022, the Volunteer Engagement Program continued to enable flexible and innovative forms of volunteering through partnerships and new initiatives



WHY DO PEOPLE VOLUNTEER AT OXFAM AUSTRALIA?

We asked volunteers about their motivations and why they choose to contribute their time to Oxfam Australia. A few common answers can be found below.



OFFICE VOLUNTEERS DOING MIGHTY GOOD THINGS

In 2022, 51 volunteers, interns and secondees generously supported Oxfam Australia and our mission. Volunteers based in six states and territories across Australia contributed nearly **3,000 hours** of their time.

Office volunteers were engaged in:

- Capability & Impact (Operations): 9 roles completed by 18 volunteers
- Programs: 5 roles completed by 5 volunteers
- Fundraising & Resource Growth: 5 roles completed by 13 volunteers
- Chief Executive Office: 4 roles completed by 7 volunteers
- Micro Volunteering Program: 1 role completed by 8 volunteers

Activating our new space - Ngapa

In late 2021, Oxfam Australia relocated to our new head office in West Melbourne. We sought to activate our space to be a place of welcome. To achieve this, a group of volunteers and staff came together to form the Ngapa Activation & Engagement Team in 2022 and together, we collectively worked on creating a space that would enable collaboration and connection.





As an organisation, we are responding to a growing demand for more flexible and innovative forms of volunteer engagement. In 2022, we tested new initiatives with the introduction our Micro Volunteering Pilot and enhanced our partnerships through the expansion of agile opportunities.

Melbourne International Comedy Festival Gala event

2022 saw the return of volunteering at the MICF Gala event, which in partnership with the festival, has been supporting Oxfam Australia for nearly 30 years. Volunteers support this important event annually by assisting with collecting donations, handing out programs and talking to audience members about Oxfam Australia and our work. Enabling flexible volunteering – Micro Volunteering Pilot

In August 2022, Oxfam Australia launched a trial to test the viability of micro volunteering organisation. Micro volunteers contribute their time to causes they care about by completing smaller, ad hoc tasks on a flexible basis. Oxfam Australia is one of the first organisations to institute micro volunteering as part of a formal volunteering program in Australia. We are grateful for the assistance of volunteers from Victoria, NSW, and Western Australia, who supported the program on a flexible basis for 5 months. Volunteers and staff found the flexible nature of the pilot to be overwhelmingly favourable which has resulted in the program creating our Micro Volunteering Program in January 2023.



Enhancing partnerships though innovation

Oxfam Australia worked alongside several corporate partners to enable innovative forms of engagement. We are grateful for contributions from Corrs Chambers Westgarth and Johnson Winter & Slattery to our secondee program, the University of New South Wales as part of their interdisciplinary partner project collaboration, as well as Deloitte Australia for 'Deloitte Impact Day', which enabled the organisation to trial agile corporate volunteering placements.

OXFAM TRAILWALKER IS BACK!

Oxfam Trailwalker returned in 2022 after a brief hiatus and we were thrilled to have 677 volunteers support our Melbourne and Sydney events. Every year, our walkers tell us the same thing: volunteers are at the top of their highlights. Whether it's a kind word, a well-timed cup of tea, or encouragement at 4am as they tackle an incline – they are an essential part of their journey. Volunteers take on many roles including Trail Marshal, Trail Marker, Sweep Team, Checkpoint Crew and Allied Health. We are incredibly grateful to have such skilled, generous, and passionate people helping tackle poverty and create a life-changing Oxfam Trailwalker experience.



MELBOURNE TRAILWALKER 2022

297 volunteers supported 1,599 walkers on the trail.

2,442 hours completed, equivalent to \$121,742 in financial value

Oxfam Australia was supported in 2022 by the generous contributions of 127 community volunteers who are engaged as part of the Oxfam Adelaide Charity Bookshop in South Australia as well as the Fair Trade Shop group based in Perth. Both groups support Oxfam Australia in enhancing awareness of our work and assist with fundraising activities in the community.



OXFAM ADELAIDE CHARITY BOOKS

The Oxfam Charity Books community group in Adelaide has been supporting Oxfam Australia and our work for 50 years! The shop is 100% managed by a very dedicated group of volunteers (many of whom have made a long-term contribution). In 2022 the shop moved to a new premises and established an online store which raised their profile and that of Oxfam Australia in the Adelaide community.

OXFAM FAIR TRADE SHOP PERTH

The Oxfam Fair Trade Shop community group in Perth is managed by a group of 16 volunteers and raises awareness about fair trade principles in the wider community and Oxfam Australia's work. The groups also spread awareness by attending various community events in and around Perth.

VOLUNTEER PROFILE

EVE BILSBOROUGH Straight Talk Research Intern (NSW)

In July of 2022 I received a call congratulating me on a successful internship application with Oxfam Australia. The placement could not have been any more ideal. Following two years of COVID-19 lockdowns, organisations now offer hybrid/remote opportunities which are great for individuals who, like myself, do not live directly in a capital city and may not have easily accessible transport to them.

The induction was quick, easy, and full of support. I have felt welcomed from my first day, all the way up until my last. Within two weeks of joining the team at Oxfam I had the opportunity to travel to the capital of Australia as an Evaluation Intern for the 2022 Straight Talk Program. This week symbolised a great kick-start of my time with the amazing and unforgettable team within Oxfam Australia, but also the culmination of my International Studies degree, which some may know, leads to many opportunities in Canberra. This was a great experience, and by far the favourite aspect of my placement. I was exposed to the workings of an NGO, the behind-the-scenes, fast-paced, and at times chaotic makings of an event, gained insight and experience with networking, had the opportunity to meet my team in-person, had the opportunity to meet with countless strong individuals, build meaningful relationships and learn about others. I was able to see the success of a large event (also taking into consideration this being the first event since the pandemic, so practising flexibility and resilience was a must) complete with generous, knowledgeable, and supportive people. This was an eye-opening experience that empowered me, and has stayed with me since, giving me guidance and clarity towards my future aspirations.

Putting theory into practice was equally as interesting and important. This occurred when I was able to aid in the collection and analysis of research regarding women's experience of the event. This is something I found quite rewarding and exciting as I was able to put theory and knowledge learnt in my degree into practice – an opportunity which is rare while studying! I felt supported and mentored throughout this journey as I have been able to gain personal confidence in myself and communication skills throughout this time with weekly team meetings and the addition of meeting with my manager and head evaluator. I found this particularly helpful as this is not something that is really practiced in classes, but more something you learn over time in settings like this.

Overall, this experience has been more rewarding, interesting, and enjoyable than imaginable. I was welcomed into a diverse, inclusive team who have offered nothing but kindness and mentorship to me. I have gained insight into what it is like to work in a team which has given me knowledge into what I may expect when applying for employment after graduation. I also built on skills where I worked collaboratively and individually. Completing this exposed me to an array of individuals who have changed my perspectives on life, and who I may not have never had the opportunity to meet had I not been in such a great team. This internship gave someone who has not had much opportunity in her life, the opportunity of a lifetime.
